## Remote Learning Plan

In September 2020, our children returned to full-time education following school closures due to Covid-19. They quickly settled into their new classes with the majority of pupils having an uninterrupted experience so far.

However, looking forward, there is the strong possibility that individual children, a class bubble, or the whole school may be required to self-isolate, or that there could be a local lockdown for a period of time. Therefore, the school has put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue their education from home. This meets the expectations set out in the DfE guidance 'Remote Education Support'.

To enable this to happen, our pupils have all been set up with a Google account linked to their own Google Classrooms. These classrooms allow the children to maintain contact with their class teachers and other staff via video meetings and emails. It is important that all children and parents know how to access their Google account. If you need any assistance with this, please contact Mrs Thomas in the school office.

In addition, the school website has been set up with a dedicated page for remote learning. On this page, you will find important information regarding remote learning during absence from school.

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support that child, providing hard copies of learning packs. It is important that parents have made the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning so that these alternative arrangements can be made.

During any absence, the class teacher will provide a variety of planned learning activities to enable the pupils to continue their learning journeys started in the classroom. This remote learning will be delivered through Google Classrooms and include attached documents, as well as signposting to appropriate teaching videos, presentations and websites. There will also be opportunities to join live and recorded lessons via Google Meet where appropriate, including story time and assemblies.

Key websites we may use for remote learning include Oak National Academy, Hamilton Trust, Interactive Resources and BBC Bitesize.



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It is expected that a child will follow the school timetable. If the class teacher is unwell, there may be some differences with this provision.

**The daily timetable could include:**

- Maths
- Reading
- Writing
- Spelling/Phonics
- Curriculum Lessons including science and foundation subjects
- Story time - children will be invited to join class story time or watch pre-recorded stories via Google Meet
- Assemblies - children may be invited to join class assemblies via Google Meet
- Daily Reading- Oxford Owl have a wide range of online books which children can access to continue their daily reading

**SEND**

If a child has SEND and has specific learning interventions and support, we will aim to continue this provision in an adapted form online if appropriate.
